GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT THE CONFERENCE OF YOUTH (COY) ON CLIMATE ISSUES

About the Program



- Building on a history of over a decade of successful, collaborative, project-based learning programs, the Centre for Global Education, alongside strategic partners, design and deliver intensive learning, advocacy, and action projects, called **Youth Dialogues**, on <u>Provincial, National, and Global scales</u>. These rich and comprehensive projects focus on exploring, empowering, and advocating deep, contextualized learning and exploration and critical dialogues between high school students.
- Students need the skills to build societies that welcome diversity and encourage an open-minded and inclusive approach, and prepare young people for the complex realities of our interconnected world. The mandate of Youth Dialogue projects is to assist youth - generally in grades 7-12 (ages 13-19) - from diverse and inclusive communities across provinces, countries and the globe - to develop a deeper understanding of issues that impact them in their lives and communities.
- Topic areas that we have facilitated events around include:
 - Energy and Climate Change
 - Biodiversity
 - ► Gender-Based Violence
 - Future of work
 - Reconciliation, etc.

- Youth Dialogues are designed, informed, and co-facilitated with multi-stakeholder experts across the academic, social-science, education, government, and advocacy fields. The online learning activities and video conference events forefront current knowledge, innovations, and perspectives, and help youth identify promising strategies, actions, policies and programs in addressing some of our nation's greatest challenges.
- These projects, spanning weeks or months, build real skills in dialogue and critical thinking, as well as empathy through sharing of regional lived experiences and perspectives. They weave together a multisystem learning approach, including:
 - Real-time, inquiry-based, interactive video conferences with expert mentors, advocates, and community leaders, Indigenous peoples, academics, and students
 - Asynchronous learning activities loaded onto the TIGed online classroom
 - Training and support in designing and launching action and/or advocacy projects
 - Youth Leadership Symposium & Writer's Retreat the outcome of which will be a global/national/provincial youth Policy Brief or Project Report [Please see Publications Section of this website for examples of such papers]

Post-Programs Activities

- At the end of the program, the students are producing White Papers that will later be presented to the world leaders at COP sessions;
- Upon returning home, the students and teachers are sharing the White Papers with their friends and teachers at school;
- Students and teachers will be sharing their experiences with their peers at their schools or other schools or UNESCO ASPNet school network;
- Students will be implementing what they have learned in classes;
- Teachers will be applying ideas at schools and following up with school collaborations;
- Schools collaboration in sister school projects that can explore wide range of possibilities for interschool partnership.

About the Indonesia-Turkey Bilateral Exchange Program in 2022

DETAIL INFORMATION ON THE BILATERAL EXCHANGE PROGRAM

About the Program



- This Indonesia-Turkey Bilateral Exchange Program is an initiative taken by Lab School Cirendeu High School after participating in the COY 16 and was paired with a school in Turkey--Dr. Binnaz Ege-Dr. Ridvan Ege Anatolian High School in Ankara to work on bilateral projects to explore further potential school partnership and collaboration on climate issues.
- The two schools met virtually on February 1st, 2022 to discuss all the possibilities and opportunities—as a part of the follow-on project of the COY 16 they both participated.
- They both agreed to organize an exchange program for both the teachers and students sometime in 2022. The initial agreement was to organize the Indonesian school to go visit the Turkish school from September 25-October 4, 2022, given the possibilities of international travels and considering the travel policy of both countries due to the pandemic.

- For about 10 days started first by the Indonesian school, then hopefully the Turkish school could come visit the Indonesian school in the same/next school academic year.
- The main agenda of the program would be (1) students can join the host school's classes and experience different teaching methods, (2) both teachers and students have separate meetings to discuss any issues i.e. academic and climate program done by both schools, (3) mini conference/forum discussing specifically on climate issues in both countries and (4) exploring the host city and observe any climate or environmental issues and how the city governments tackle the issues.
- It is hoped that after the exchange program the two schools can maintain their partnership and develop the program into a so-called sister school project.



They students exchanged ideas and offered their personal views by using 1-2 power point slides. The schedule of the online dialogues, which began in March 2022:

Memorandum of Understanding

<u>Memorandum of Understanding</u> <u>for Academic Exchange and Cooperation</u> *Mutabakat zaptı Akademik Değişim ve İşbirliği için*

 Labschool Cirendeu Senior High School and Dr. Binnaz Ege-Dr. Ridvan Ege Anatolian High School, wishing to promote cooperation in the areas of education, academic research and project and cultural performances, agree to the following:

Labschool Cirendeu Lisesi ve Dr. Binnaz Ege-Dr. Rıdvan Ege Anadolu Lisesi, eğitim, akademik araştırma ve proje ve kültürel performans alanlarında işbirliğini geliştirmek isteyen aşağıdaki maddeleri kabul eder:

1.1. To encourage exchanges and visits among; students, teachers, and non-teaching faculty members in the two schools.

- 1.2. To exchange information, materials and theme of curriculum in which both schools are interested in.

- 1.3. To assist individuals or the faculty in accomplishing required negotiations and arrangements in the above exchanges.

- 1.5. To arrange joint research activities and publications. Ortak araştırma faaliyetleri ve yayınlar düzenlemek.
- 2. Details for another specific will be developed in the future from mutual consultation and negotiation. The two schools are now doing the Decarbonize Project under the Conference of Youth Program. Başka bir spesifik için ayrıntılar, gelecekte karşılıklı istişare ve müzakere yoluyla geliştirilecektir. - 3. This MOU expires one year ahead since it is signed. It may also be extended by either party by giving formal notice in writing.
